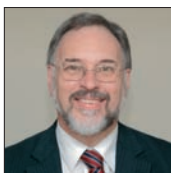

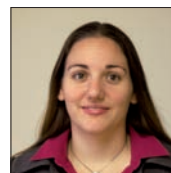

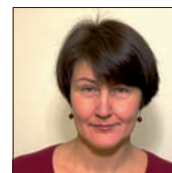

Message from our Chief Executive

AMDEA has experienced two major changes this year with the departure of both Uwe Hanneck and Alex Martin.

Uwe Hanneck of BSH, who has been Chairman of the Board since before I joined AMDEA, retired from the industry this year and his final term of office ended in October. He is succeeded by John Morrissey. Alex Martin, our Technical Officer, after three years' sterling work, decided to return to industry to pursue his career. Our new Technical Officer, Chrissy Beer, joined in October.

Our two remaining technical stalwarts, Stuart MacConnacher and Richard Hughes, continued their work on various international standards committees, especially on those standards that support European legislation. This year Richard was given the International Electrotechnical Committee's 1906 Award for his work on standby, an award that Stuart has also been given in the past. In 2011 AMDEA has hosted several standards meetings for BSI, IEC and CENELEC.

Throughout the year AMDEA continued its involvement in the process of developing and implementing regulations, both in Europe and in the UK, partly through our contacts with Government departments but also through our links to other organisations such as CECED (European Committee of Domestic Equipment Manufacturers) and the CBI (Confederation of British Industry).

Communication remains the key to our success. We have daily e-mail and telephone contact with our members plus regular meetings of our Panels, supplemented by my visits to individual members. We have installed a new telephone system in the AMDEA office which allows us to interact with e-mail as well – a great improvement on the rather antiquated set up that we had before. We also redesigned our Time to Change website and launched another, ancillary, site for Food Waste Disposers. Ultimately these will become satellites for the main AMDEA website which we are planning to upgrade in 2012.

Our monthly Newsletter and TechNews plus the weekly TechAlert have been supplemented by occasional summaries of topics of interest as they arise. And our Briefing events this year covered smart grids, WEEE, market surveillance, and ecodesign and energy labelling with external speakers from the

National Measurement Office, National Grid and De Montfort University, among others.

This year we amended our committee structure by creating two new Panels to deal with safety issues. The Board, Technical Committee and Commercial Committee all met regularly again this year, supported by their specialist Panels. The Customer Care Workshop set up by the Spares and Service Panel has been discussing improvements to the existing AMDEA Code of Practice on Servicing, while the Small Appliances Panel has been contributing to the progress of the Ecodesign and Energy Labelling Regulations for vacuum cleaners.

Our campaigning activity has become more ambitious this year. Expanding from our Time to Change studies we are embarking on a project with a university partner to conduct some research into household energy use. This will provide us with valuable evidence for our promotion of modern domestic appliances as a significant tool to reduce household energy use and carbon emissions. We intend to publish a report of the research in the spring.

We come to the end of 2011 in an excellent financial state, with more members, enhanced services and, for the fifth year running, no increase in subscription rates.

So we look forward to another interesting year in 2012.

AMDEA Services for Members

AMDEA is the UK trade association for large and small domestic appliances; heating; water heating; floor care and ventilation. We represent our members at UK, European and International level; with government and EU political institutions; in standards and approvals; with non-governmental organisations; with consumers and in the media. AMDEA has a Board of Directors comprising the CEOs of member companies who are responsible for our strategic planning.

Meetings

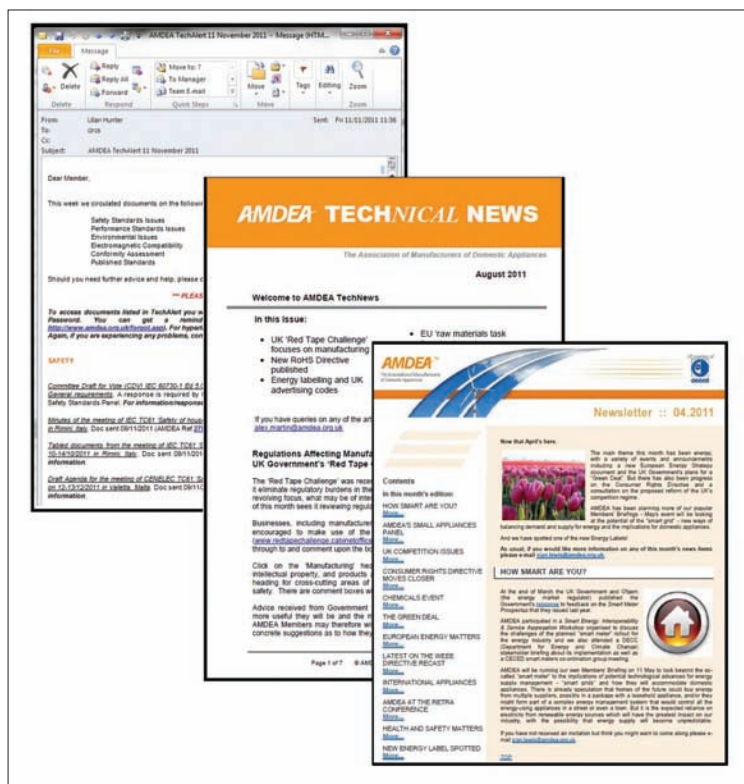
AMDEA has two main committees – Commercial and Technical. Each has a subset of Panels and working groups and representatives from member companies may join any of them. While many Panels just exchange information and comments, others meet, either to discuss a particular topic or on a regular basis. Anyone unable to attend a meeting can always nominate a colleague to go instead. AMDEA will send out agendas, take minutes and invite any external speakers. Presentations given at meetings are also circulated subsequently.

Staff

We have six members of staff based in the London office - the Chief Executive, the Office Manager, three technical experts and a communications person. They are all contactable by e-mail or by telephone and members are always welcome to drop in if they are in the area.

Briefings

We run regular Briefing events for members with presentations from our technical staff and external speakers - topics have included Safety and Standards; Consumer Rights; Ecodesign and Energy Labelling; and RoHS and WEEE. These are valuable training sessions for key staff in our member companies.



AMDEA Services for Members

Standards

AMDEA advises on the implementation of Standards and how they affect the UK market. We are also involved in the development of standards through our representation in BSI (British Standards Institution); CENELEC (European Committee for Electrotechnical Standardization), IEC (International Electrotechnical Commission) and CISPR (Special International Committee on Radio Interference).

Statistics

AMDEA provides its members with a statistics service - participating members receive monthly updates of market data and the Board and Commercial Committee of AMDEA receive regular reports on recent figures, market trends and projections.

Mailings

As well as daily updates on legislation and standards changes, each Friday we send our members a summary of what technical information we have circulated that week. The TechAlert contains links to all the documents that have been circulated and are uploaded onto the AMDEA database.

Websites

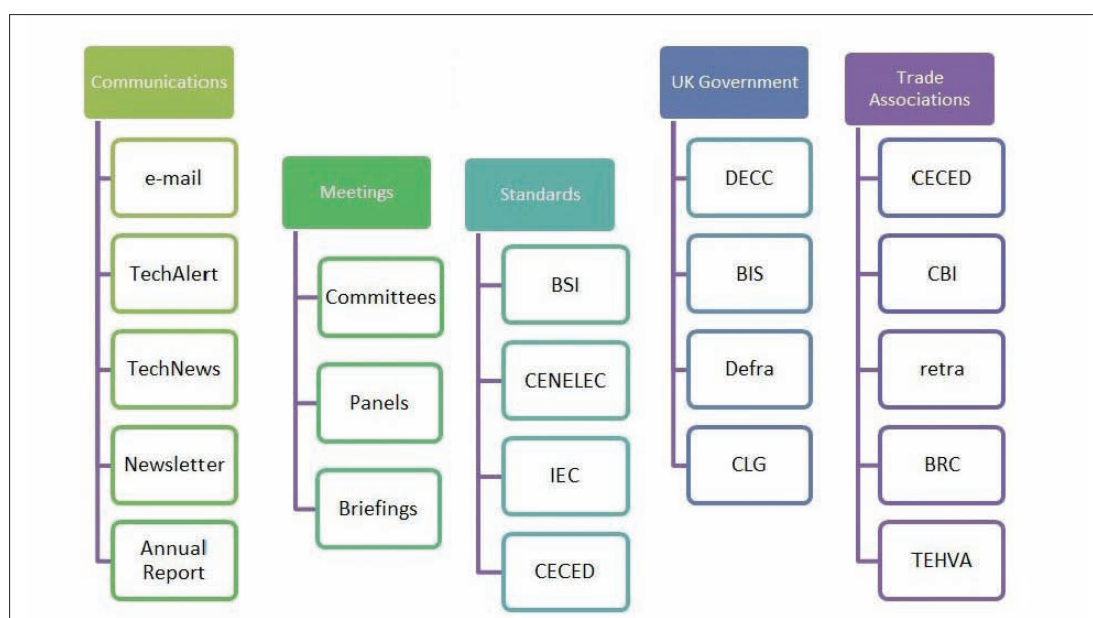
The AMDEA website contains some information for the casual visitor but its main function is to allow members to access our vast library of documents. We also have two other websites aimed at consumers – one for the Time to Change campaign which was redesigned at the end of last year and is now being updated to take account of the new energy labels, and one to promote Food Waste Disposers.

Communications

We publish two monthly newsletters electronically - TechNews is sent to technical staff employed by our members, while the AMDEA Newsletter goes to a wider audience including non-member contacts.

We send regular reports on issues of concern as they arise and we respond every day to requests for information and advice from our members. We also deal with enquiries from government agencies, the press and members of the public.

Our Annual Report goes to all our members giving a yearly summary of the previous 12 months' activities and provides useful information about the AMDEA membership.





Campaigns

In 2011 the AMDEA Board agreed to embark on a wide-ranging campaign over the next three years to promote AMDEA and our industry.

Building on the success of the Time to Change Campaign we decided to look at ways to promote domestic appliances as a key tool in the fight against climate change.

We commissioned some research from the University of Surrey to provide us with valuable evidence. This will involve monitoring domestic energy use in the real world and then looking at the impact of replacing appliances with modern, energy-efficient models. We expect to publish a report on this pilot study in the spring of 2012 and are hoping to attract external funding to embark on a more ambitious programme involving more houses later in the year.

We also held discussions with UK Government Departments on issues such as the draft Ecodesign Regulation for tumble dryers, the scope of the UK WEEE Regulations and work on defining "child appealing" appliances.

And we set up a new vacuum cleaner group to look at opportunities for promoting our low carbon homes campaign.



AMDEA's 'Time to Change' campaign started in 2006 and aimed to promote our industry's amazing improvements to the energy efficiency of domestic appliances as well as giving consumers information about the potential energy (and cost) savings they could make by replacing their old appliances.

The new and improved website (www.t2c.org.uk) is still being expanded and we have updated both the calculator and the energy label information.

We ran another fridge case study – this time comparing a 20 year old fridge with an A+ (the last study was a 30 year old fridge and an A++ which demonstrated an 80% reduction in energy use).

The AMDEA Food Waste Disposer (FWD) Group had a very successful year.

Each of the UK's devolved administrations is at a different stage of reviewing their waste policies and AMDEA has been talking to MPs (including the Prime Minister), MSPs, and AMs as well as to the London Assembly.

We have also met representatives of the water companies, Ofwat and the Environment Agency and the Scottish Environmental Protection Agency as well as London Boroughs and District Councils.

We responded to the London Assembly's draft waste management consultation and two Welsh Assembly Government consultations on waste policy.

External links

AMDEA has regular meetings with representatives from the UK Government Departments Defra (Environment, Food and Rural Affairs) and BIS (Business, Innovation and Skills) and are in contact with DECC (Energy and Climate Change) and CLG (Communities and Local Government). Other UK bodies with whom we have regular dealings are the Environment Agency, the National Measurement Office and EEPH (Energy Efficiency Partnership for Homes).

AMDEA is a member of the CBI (Confederation of British Industry) and Douglas Herbison is on the Trade Association Council. We are also members of the Microwave Technologies Association and Sian Lewis is the Deputy Chairman.

We are a National Association member of the European Committee of Domestic Appliance Manufacturers – CECED and AMDEA staff are involved in a range of their meetings throughout the year. Many of these are teleconferences rather than physical meetings and we also contribute to their submissions to the European Commission.

AMDEA is also a member of the Air Conditioning and Refrigeration Industry Board (ACRIB) which brings together trade associations related to refrigeration and Stuart MacConnacher sits on their Board.

We continue to be involved with the charities promoting gas safety and we support the Household Electrical and Electronic Servicing Training Forum, HEEST, as well as supplying articles for magazines and responses to press enquiries.

We work closely with retra (the Radio, Electrical and Television Retailers' Association) and Douglas Herbison was a speaker at their annual conference this year.

We also liaise with other organisations such as SEAMA (the Small Electrical Appliance Marketing Association), BEAMA (British Electrotechnical and Allied Manufacturers' Association) and Intellect (the Consumer Electronics and ICT Association) as well as other associations at a more informal level.

Other meetings for AMDEA this year have included an event to promote the "Special Relationship" between the UK and India; the international Appliance Manufacturer Associations Forum in Brussels; the first ever UK REACH Stakeholder event organised by the Health and Safety Executive; and a delegation from Turkey investigating ecodesign and energy labelling in the UK.

Technical Matters

The work of AMDEA's technical team is broadly divided into four areas – legislation, government policy, standards, and market surveillance.

Product legislation is typically set at EU level and then transposed into UK law. AMDEA focuses on legislation related to safety, electromagnetic compatibility (EMC) and environmental protection. Of these, laws to protect the environment cover energy consumption, chemical use and end of life arrangements.

Government policy varies with which political party is in power. This year has seen the launch of the 'red tape challenge' and consultations on 'smart meters', among others.

Standards cover all aspects of modern day life but AMDEA focuses on those supporting European legislative requirements such as safety, EMC, environment and performance.

AMDEA seeks to influence EU policy on market surveillance and enforcement. Each Member State is responsible for these in their own territory and so AMDEA maintains strong links with the relevant UK Government Departments looking at legal and civil measures to ensure compliance.

NEW LEGISLATIVE FRAMEWORK

In 2008 three important measures were agreed that affect requirements relating to CE marking Directives; market surveillance; and accreditation of conformity assessment bodies. This will result in 10 Directives being revised, the most important for our sector being the Low Voltage Directive (covering safety) and the EMC (electromagnetic compatibility) Directive.

SAFETY LEGISLATION

Last year the European Parliament decided to amend the General Product Safety Directive to include provisions to enhance the market; strengthen customs checks in European ports and facilitate speedier withdrawal of dangerous products.

Under the Low Voltage Directive there is particular concern for vulnerable persons i.e. the young, elderly and those with disabilities. So standards for temperatures of accessible surfaces; concerns about so-called "child appealing" products and food safety (formerly classed as a performance issue) are currently key themes.

ENERGY LEGISLATION

Richard Hughes convenes the group which developed standards to support the Standby and External Power Supplies Regulations. As a result of his representations to the European Commission, the Regulation will be amended.

AMDEA responded to a UK Government consultation on CERT (Carbon Emissions Reduction Target) - an obligation on energy suppliers to demonstrate how they have reduced household energy use.

The new Ecodesign and Energy Labelling Regulations for fridge-freezers, washing machines and dishwashers became mandatory at the end of 2011 and more Regulations will appear in 2012.

Our May Briefing looked at the potential for smart grid technology. AMDEA also responded to UK Government consultations on "smart meters" in which we reiterated the importance of standards and the necessity for such meters to be upgradable to meet any future Europe-wide requirements.

WASTE LEGISLATION

Debate on the planned recast of the Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Directive continued throughout 2011. AMDEA convened and chairs the Producers' Group, who meet regularly with BIS. We are also part of BIS's consultative groups on WEEE.

AMDEA was involved in writing the UK publicly available specification (PAS) for re-use equipment and the related certification scheme in addition to WEEE treatment standards being developed in CENELEC.

Technical Matters

AMDEA's Food Waste Disposer (FWD) Group had a successful year talking to MPs and MSPs (including the Prime Minister), representatives of the EA, the Scottish Environmental Protection Agency, and water companies.

CHEMICALS LEGISLATION

The recast Directive on Restriction of Hazardous Substances (RoHS) was published and will be transposed into UK law during 2012. The number of restricted substances will remain the same but the processes used by companies to demonstrate conformity may need to change because the Directive is "CE marking".

Under the REACH (Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and restriction of CHemicals) Regulation the European Chemicals Agency agreed on the identification of eight more "Substances of Very High Concern" for the Candidate List, which AMDEA circulated to members.

STANDARDS

The European Commission's plans to revise the system of standardisation continue, with a Regulation expected in 2012.

Stuart MacConnacher of AMDEA is attending regular CENELEC meetings throughout Europe discussing vulnerable persons and also the revision of standards covered by the Machinery Directive. He convenes the CENELEC working group dealing with the safety of child-appealing appliances.

Concerns about touchable surface temperatures have also been raised in Australia/New Zealand so the standards community is trying to move this work into the IEC to ensure that there is a consistent approach world-wide.

Performance standardisation has been focused on ecodesign and energy labelling not just in Europe but in other countries with similar legislation. Existing standards have been upgraded and some, like those for refrigeration products, have been completely revised.

Richard Hughes of AMDEA won a 1906 Award for his contribution to standards work for the International Electrotechnical Commission on greenhouse gases.

Stuart MacConnacher has also previously won this award (twice!) and AMDEA is delighted that our staff are being recognised for their sterling work.

MARKET SURVEILLANCE

Each EU Member State is responsible for its own enforcement of legislation (including transposed Directives). Effective market surveillance requires a balanced approach to intervention and this is something that AMDEA looks at very carefully when commenting on draft UK legislation.

The National Measurement Office (NMO) is the Market Surveillance Authority for Ecodesign, Energy Labelling and RoHS. They have visited AMDEA and indeed were key speakers at two of our Member Briefings this year.

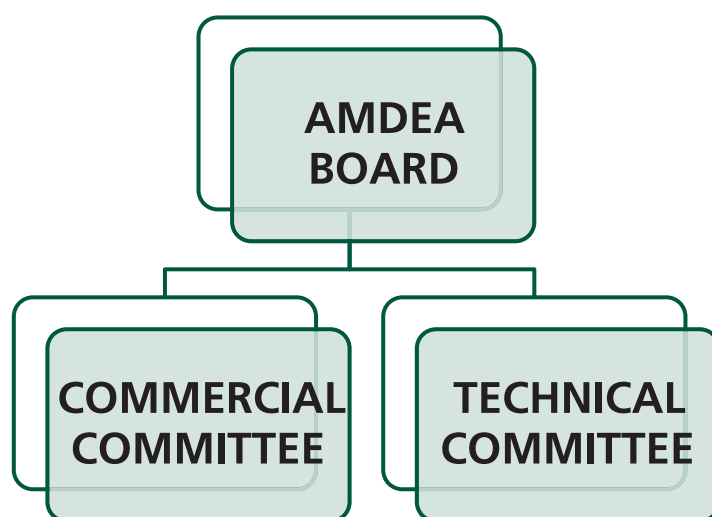

The Safety Panel has been split into two new Panels: a Corrective Action Panel to deal with risk assessment, RAPEX and revisions to AMDEA's Corrective Action Code of Practice, and a Safety Liaison Panel to deal with fire safety issues and maintain communications with fire and rescue services and the government. We have also created a new vacuum cleaner group to help in our campaigning activities.
